REMEMBER:

1. Your participation grade is based on your ATTENDANCE and PARTICIPATION IN CLASS!!!

2. You will receive <u>20 points every day</u>. If you are tardy, you will lose ½ of your daily participation grade, bringing you down to 10 points for that day. Remember, if you are absent, you must make up these points (excused and unexcused absences). Students will be responsible for keeping a Theatre binder throughout the semester. This binder will contain all notes, hand-outs, quizzes, and assignments. This binder will be handed in and graded the day before the end of each term.

- 3. Play Performance and Play Reports: You are required to earn 100 points per production, by attending theatre productions at Monarch High or other productions (with teacher's approval) and completing a review of the performance in class. You are required to go to one performance per semester.
- 4. Exams: Expect a test and quiz over major concepts studied.
- 5. Wear a black shirt for each performance in class.

ALSO REMEMBER:

ATTENDANCE—Since this is a participatory class, your attendance is very crucial. If you miss work or a performances in class, you MUST MAKE IT UP by doing extra scenes, reports, etc. for the points. If the work is a group activity, you will be replaced after two days of absences. If you are absent the day of a performance, I will call home to confirm your absence. If it is excused, you will then perform the first day you return to school. Remember, you get a daily grade for participating. BE ON TIME AND PARTICIPATE—Time is precious in a theatre class. Therefore, if you are late, you are not prepared and will result in the loss of participation points. Excessive tardies will not only cause you to lose points, bathroom passes will not be accepted at the end of the term, and a detention will also be given.
